Intro to BroadWay

The primary objective of BroadWay is to procure technical solutions to enable a new Operational Mobility capability. This new Operational Mobility capability should allow PPDR responders to use their broadband mobile technology and services wherever they are in Europe and be able to collaborate with responders from other European countries. Mobile broadband will allow for exchange of rich media – video, detailed images, etc. overall improving situation awareness and information exchange possibilities.

BroadWay (www.broadway-info.eu) immediately commenced in May 2018 working based on outcomes of the BroadMap project (www.broadmap.eu).

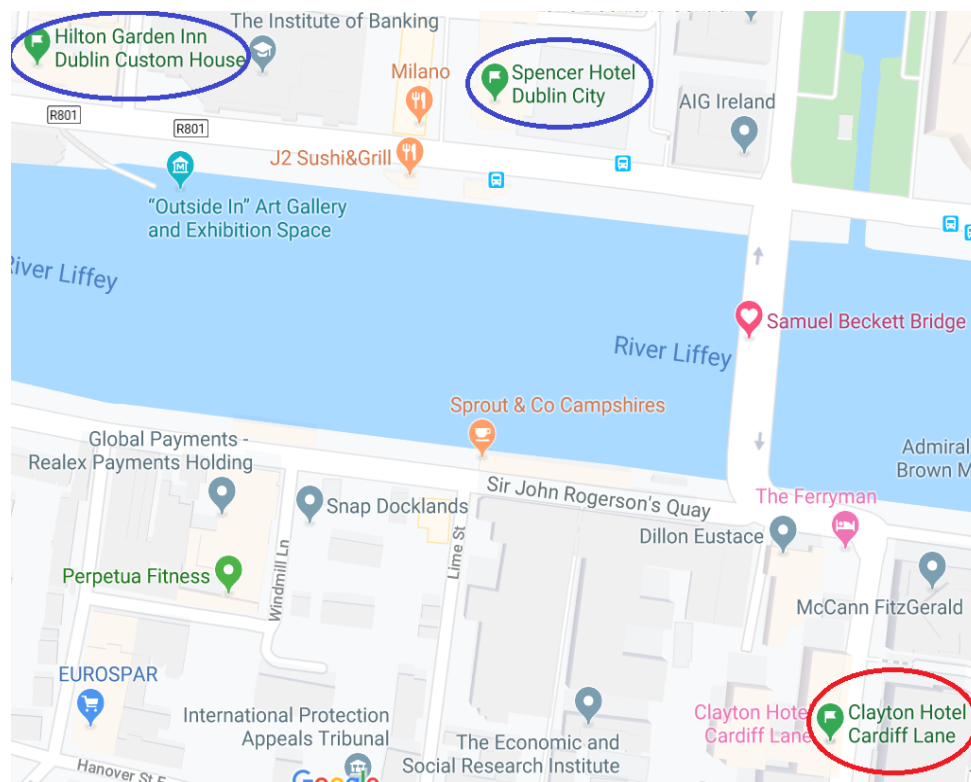
BroadWay will procure pre-commercial designs, prototypes and a pan-European pilot system to solve the BroadWay challenge – pan-European mobile broadband for public safety. This system will be formally procured from industry and will give you the possibility to trial and evaluate mobile broadband technologies, before our team considers procuring the final live solution.
